Why is the EIB funding a solar plant in Kosovo?

The EIB is providing EUR33 million for the construction of one of Kosovo's largest solar photovoltaic plants. The new plant will contribute to higher energy security and the phasing out of coal-based power generation.

How can the EIB support the green transition in Kosovo?

To support the green transition in Kosovo*, the European Investment Bank (EIB) has signed a EUR33 million investment loan for the construction of one of its largest solar photovoltaic plants near Pristina - with a capacity of up to 100 MWac (120MWp).

Why is Kosovo building a photovoltaic plant?

Kosovo's Minister of Finance, Labour and Transfers Hekuran Murati said: "The signing of today's agreement for the construction of the photovoltaic plant is a landmark moment as Kosovo advances its initiatives to secure renewable energy use for its citizens.

The grant will be combined with loans from the EIB (EUR33 million) and KfW (EUR29 million), which will implement the project under the Mutual Reliance Initiative aiming to increase the ...

The cost is EUR 104 million, which will be jointly funded by several donors, including the EU with grants from the Western Balkan Investment Framework (WBIF) and the European Development Bank (EIB). ...
